The last days of fighting before the armistice in Korea brought death to a Teaneck High School graduate and injury to another.

Naval Lieut. Daniel Richard Paul, one time football star at Teaneck High School, was killed when his fighter plane crashed off the east coast of Korea as he was returning to his aircraft carrier.

The son of Mr. and Mrs. Daniel Paul who lived on Wood Road in Teaneck at the time he was graduated from Teaneck High in 1942. Lieut. Paul was a resident of California at the time of his death. He is survived by his wife and two daughters. He enlisted in World War II after graduation and re-enlisted in the Korean War.

Lieut. Robert Werckle, of the First Marine Division, son of Mr. and Mrs. E. A. Werckle of 309 Churchill Road,

West Englewood, was injured on July 23, 1953, Tuesday. They received ten five hours of treatment, stating that he has wounds in his leg and is in danger.
