The President will attend afternoon services for Dr. Ernest L. Nixon, 85, who died Tuesday night in the Center County Hospital at Bellefont, Pa., where he had been a patient since Feb. 17.

Dr. Nixon was the youngest brother of the President's father.

Ronald Ziegler, presidential news secretary, said in Washington the President had derived a great deal of inspiration from his uncle, the only member of the elder Nixon's family to receive a higher education.

Zeigler said the fact that Dr. Nixon had worked his way through college, eventually earning a Ph. D., had encouraged the President to follow in his footsteps when he was a young man.

Funeral services were planned at the Koch Funeral Home; about one-half block from the campus of Pennsylvania State University where Dr. Nixon was a faculty member from 1917 to 1940.

He was known as the potato wizard of Pennsylvania for his contributions toward making potato farming a productive industry in the state.

Dr. Nixon was a native of Mount Pleasant, Ohio. He received bachelor's and master's degree from Ohio University and his doctorate from Columbia University in 1927.

He founded the "400 Bushel Potato Club" to increase acreage yields in the state, the Pennsylvania Potato Cooperative Growers to market crops, and was credited with significant contributions to fruit research.

Survivors include his wife, the former Mary Kennedy, of State College; two daughters, Mrs. Lavan Linton, of Cleveland, Ohio, and Mrs. Charles J. Noll of State College; and a son, Leland W., of State College.
