A memorial service was held Wednesday at Eglin Air Base, near Fort Walton Beach, for Lieutenant Shagner and for Captain James J. Walsh, 35, of Washington, D. C., a member of the 4410th Combat Crew Training Squadron. The two were killed in the fiery crash on a gunnery range.

In addition to his parents, Lieutenant Shagner is survived by his wife Lucinda, daughter of Major and Mrs. Dan L. Wyckoff of Ramsey Air Force Base, Puerto Rico; and a sister, Sigrid.

Lieutenant Shagner was grad-

uated from Teaneck High School in 1958.

He received a commission and a bachelor of science degree from the Air Force Academy in 1963. He was assigned to Hurlburt Field, Fla., for flight duty in a Technical Air Command support unit.

When he was graduated last fall from the flying training school at Laredo, Texas, he was awarded silver pilot wings.

In high school Lieutenant Shagner was an outstanding student.

Miss Helen Hill, principal, said, "William prepared himself for the Air Force from the time he entered the school. He was intent on a flying career. We are all shocked and extend our sympathy to his family."

The Lieutenant's sister, Sigrid, was graduated from the high school in 1961.

Born in Jersey City, Lieutenant Shagner attended Teaneck elementary schools except for 2 years when the family moved to Salena, Kan., and then returned here.

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
