## RICHARD H. DICKSON, STORE MANAGER, DIES

Richard H. Dickson of 36 Brown street died yesterday. Born in New York city, he had served as manager of the Springfield Wall Paper and Paint company since July, 1929. He leaves his widow, Mrs Hazel Parker Dickson; two brothers, Archibald of Brooklyn, N. Y., and Walter of Astoria, L. I., three sisters, Mrs Henrietta Mennella of Astoria, Mrs Marie Geovese of Long Island, and Mrs James Jacob of Hackensack, N. J.

He served as a radio operator in the first World war, receiving his electrician's training at the U. S. Naval Training school at Pelham Bay park, N. Y., and his radio training at the U. S. Naval radio school, Cambridge.

Before coming to this city he was associated with the Campbell Wall Paper company of New Jersey, managing stores in Pittsburg, Chicago and St. Louis. He was a member of the Hackensack Lodge of Elks and Springfield Lodge, 61. The funeral will be held at the Ricardo funeral home, Hackensack, N. J., Friday afternoon at 2. Burial will be in Hackensack cemetery. The body may be seen at Byron's funeral home until this afternoon at 5.
