

*Teaneck - Biography*  
**Leland F. Ferry, 83,**  
**former judge, lawyer**

Leland F. Ferry, an attorney and former judge of the First Criminal Judicial District Court of Bergen County, died Friday. He was 83.

A Teaneck resident since 1911, Mr. Ferry received his bachelor of laws in 1924 from New York University. He later took advanced law courses at Columbia University, was admitted to the bar in 1925, and became counselor-at-law in 1930.

He became assistant attorney-general of New Jersey in 1934. From 1935 to 1937, he served as first assistant prosecutor in Bergen County. In 1937, he became judge in the First Criminal Judicial District Court in Bergen County, where he stayed until 1944.

Mr. Ferry was also former borough attorney for Dumont, Westwood, and Harrington Park. During World War II, he was an

appeal agent for the U.S. Selective Service.

In 1947, he was the Bergen County delegate to the New Jersey Constitutional Convention and was voted leading citizen of Teaneck by the town's Joint Civic Association that year.

Mr. Ferry served as attorney for Teaneck from 1958 to 1963. Thereafter, he was in private law practice.

Mr. Ferry was also a veteran of World War I, serving in the 211th Field Signal Battalion of the Signal Corps.

Surviving are his wife, Lois Ann Curtis Ferry; a daughter, Lorinda Woehl; two sons, Leland Jr., and Curtis, and two grandchildren.

Services and burial were private. Arrangements were made by the Volk Funeral Home, Teaneck.
