Solemn Rites For Christmas Due In Church

TEANECK — The traditional midnight Christ-Mass will begin at 11:00 p.m. at Grace Lutheran Church on Christmas Eve. It will be preceded by a 20 minute recital on the Arthur Theis Memorial Chimes.

At 11 p.m. the choir, acolytes and clergy will enter the church for the Christ-Mass. It will be a solemn celebration with the Rev. Theodore W. Beiderwieden, pas-

tor, as celebrant; the Rev. John S. Damm, assistant pastor, as deacon; and the Rev. Vicar Norman Johnson serving as sub-deacon. David Abrahamson will serve as master-of-ceremonies with the St. Timothy Guild of Acolytes.

Pastor Beiderwieden will preach the sermon. The choir, under the direction of Cantor Emil Granquist, will provide

Nandor Nimberger Rites; Air Force Lieut. In WWII

TEANECK — Funeral services for Nandor Nimberger of 505 Maitland ave. were held Thursday, Dec. 17, in Musician's Jewish Memorial Chapel, Hackensack, with Rabbi Soloff of the East End Temple, New York City, officiating. Interment was in King Solomon Memorial Park, Clifton.

Mr. Nimberger died Tuesday, Dec. 15, in St. Mary's Hospital, Hoboken. He was 48.

Born in New York City, Mr. Nimberger attended West New York schools and New York University. During World War II he was a first lieutenant in the U.S. Army Air Force. He served in the Burma-China-India Theatre of Operations.

Mr. Nimberger was awarded the American Campaign Medal, the World War II Victory Medal

and the Asiatic-Pacific Campaign Medal.

In the business world Mr. Nimberger was a member of the Wine and Liquor Salesmen's Union of New Jersey, Local No. 19. He had handled many conventions for the Union and was the shop steward for the Flagstaff Liquor Co.

Surviving are his wife, Mrs. Rose A. Nimberger, advertising manager of THE SUN TIMES; two daughters, Anita and Marcia and a son, Gerald, at home; a brother, Samuel, of New York City; a sister, Mrs. Elsie Kessler of Bergenfield, and his mother, Mrs. Rose Nimberger.

The traditional period of mourning was observed at the family residence. In lieu of flowers the family requested that contributions in Mr. Nimberger's memory be made to the donor's favorite charity.
