West Englewood Man To Get Ground Training

Newport, R. I., Aug. 18—James Warren Bonneville of West Englewood, N. J., has arrived here at this Naval Training Station's School of the Recruit for instruction in fundamentals.

He enlisted with preference for rating in the mechanical ground crew of the Naval Air Force.

Bonneville is the only son of Mr. and Mrs. Guidose J. Bonneville of 126 Ayers Court, West Englewood. He will be 22 years old November 25.

He attended Washington School 2 in Teaneck and was graduated from Teaneck High School in 1938 when he began work in the Kearny plant of the Western Electric Corporation.

His father has been department executive there for 28 years. His parents have lived in areas of Teaneck for 15 years.

Chester W. Sheets Rises Rapidly In Army

Chester W. Sheets of Teaneck, N. J., good enough to pitch his way into a contract with the St. Louis Cardinals baseball team, scored another win here at this Field Artillery Officer Candidate School in gaining a commission as second lieutenant less than six months after being drafted.

Sheets hurled for the Teaneck High School varsity and later for outstanding semi-pro teams in Bergen County. It was in a game for the varsity against Westwood High School that he pitched the first of the two no-hit no-run games showing on his record. He made the lineup of the Bergen Evening Record All-County baseball team five years ago. He will be 23 years old October 8.

His second shutout was for the Bogota baseball club in its game against Hurd's All-Star baseball club of Hackensack.

Three years after his graduation he was brought to notice of the Cardinal management and made the squad. He was assigned for seasoning with Cardinal farm team at Daytona Beach, Fla., and Williamson, W. Va.

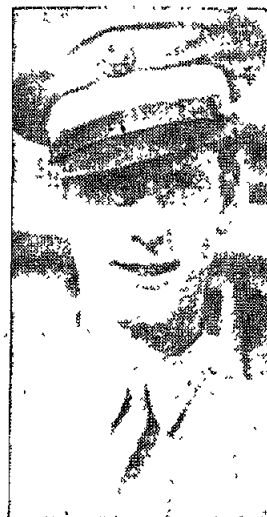
Sheets was drafted by the Teaneck Local Board last February 2. He was detached from Fort Dix for training at Fort Bragg, N. C., and there earned his corporal chevrons. Now he has been given orders to report at Camp Blanding, Fla.

He was graduated from Teaneck High School in 1937 and continued his studies at Bergen College and Pace Institute. He worked for the International Harvester Corporation at the time he was drafted.

At Teaneck High he was vice-president of his class and also of the Hi-Y Club. He is the only son of Mr. and Mrs. Ward Sheets of 239 Grayson Place, Teaneck. His sister Miss Virginia Sheets is a professional model.

Sheets pitched for two years for the Bogota Club and for another two for Ruckdeschel's Baseball Club of Hackensack.
