Lt. Francis Gill, Mass Tomorrow

Long Beach, May 1—Lt. Francis Gill of 90 Wyoming Ave. has been killed in action on Luzon, according to word received from the War Department by his parents, Mr. and Mrs. Frederick J. Gill. He was 28. Lieutenant Gill was born in Brooklyn, where his father was in the real estate business in Flatbush until about 12 years ago. The Gill family then became permanent residents of Long Beach. Following his graduation from Long Beach High School, he was employed as a clerk for Reuben A. Lazarus, then counsel for the Board of Statutory Consolidation.

A member of the 69th Regiment, young Gill entered the army and became a sergeant while stationed at Hawaii. He later attended officer's school and was commissioned second lieutenant of infantry in March, 1943, at Fort Benning, Ga. His promotion to first lieutenant came on the battlefield in the Philippines about three months ago. Before that he was on New Guinea. Surviving, besides his parents are his widow, the former Marie Boselman of Teaneck, N. J.; a sister, Mrs. Carolyn Haag, and two brothers, Patrolman Fred G. Gill of Westfield, N. J., and Detective Arthur F. Gill of the New York Police Department.

A requiem mass will be offered at 7:30 a.m. Wednesday at St. Ignatius Martyr R. C. Church.
