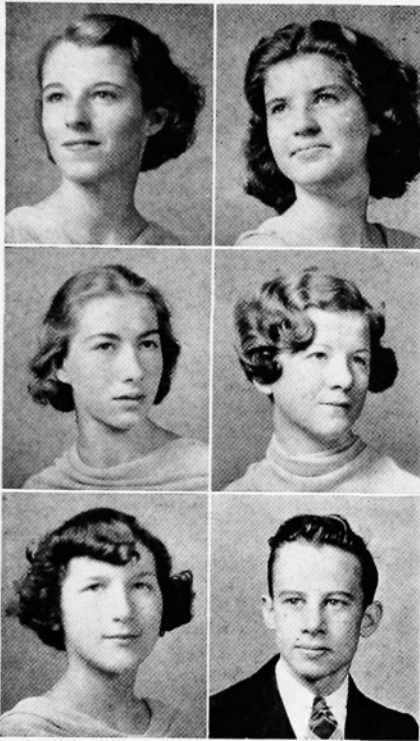


Hi-Way
