

20-Year Pastor In Teaneck Reports For Army Training

The Rev. Mr. Rowland Enters Harvard School To Qualify For Service In Second War

Cambridge, Mass., Aug. 10—The Rev. Reginald Rowland of Teaneck, N. J., for 20 years pastor of the Presbyterian Church of Teaneck, arrived here today for training as an Army chaplain, commissioned as first lieutenant.

In the last war he also served with the same rank as an Army chaplain and missed overseas assignment just as the Armistice was signed.

Today he joins other clergymen at the Army Chaplain's School at Harvard University.

He preached his last sermon on August 2. Yesterday his place in the pulpit was taken by the Rev. Fred Buchholz, pastor of the Lyndhurst Presbyterian Church.

Teaneck Post 128 of the American Legion of which he is a member, toasted the clergyman at a going away party.

Mr. Rowland lives with his wife and their two daughters at 25 Church Street, West Englewood. One daughter, Peggy Rowland, just graduated from Teaneck High School, will matriculate at Middlebury (Vt.) College. The other daughter, Sally, is a student at Teaneck Junior High School.

The recruit-chaplain answered the call to the local church when he was serving as assistant pastor at the New York Avenue Presbyterian Church in Washington, D. C.

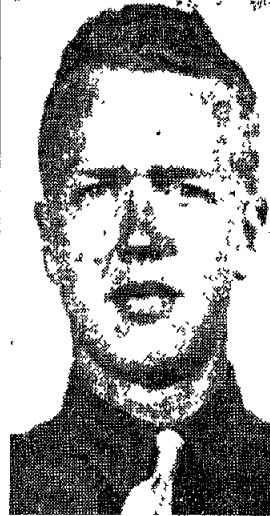
