In its second encounter, against its favored opponent, Englewood, the Ramblers played a bang-up game and emerged the victor by a 7-6 count.

Overconfident by its win over Englewood the week before, and regarding Dumont as a weak team, Teaneck went down to its second defeat by a 6-0 score.

The Ruess brothers, Eddie and Leonard, did all the scoring in the Hawthorne game to give Teaneck a 13-6 victory.

The Tenaflly fracas was a bitterly fought contest that was close throughout the entire forty-eight minutes of play. By converting an after-touchdown-kick Tenaflly won by a 7-6 score.

Outplayed for the first time by a heavy and scrappy Ridgewood eleven, the Hiwaymen lost their next encounter by a score of 13-6.

The Blue and White held Bogota's Ed Beckman, ultimate high scorer of the county, in check but could not push across the winning touchdown. The score ended in a 0-0 deadlock.
