EDITH PINES

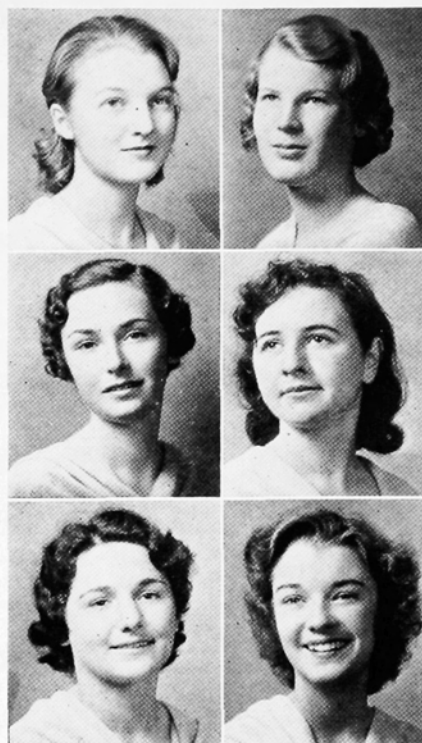
Easy-going "Edie" . . . would like to take up professional dancing . . . but thinks that being a secretary sounds a little more probable . . . her hobby is art.
