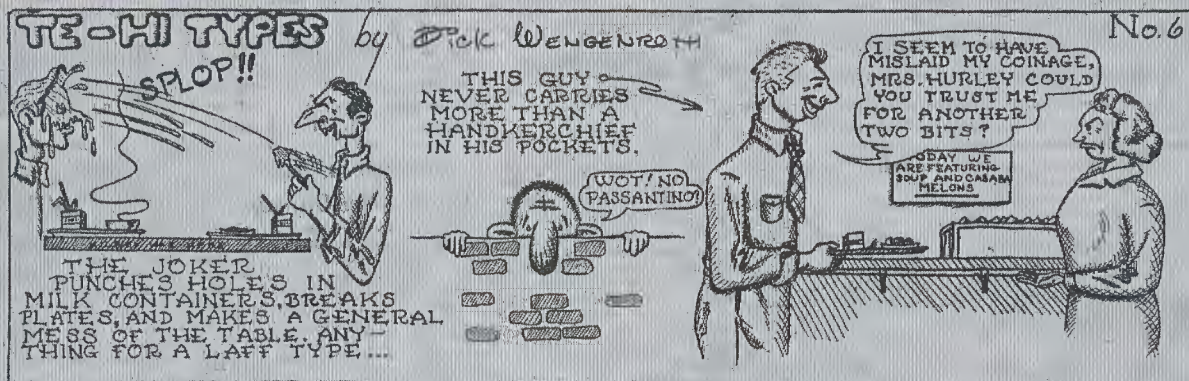




Platter Patter
