**Sheridan met death as a B-24 Liberator** waist gunner on the hedge-hop bombing of the wide-spread Ploesti oil acres in Rumania August 1. This news came Saturday from the War Department and shattered the hope of his parents that he might be living. The Department August 12 wired the family he had then been reported missing in action.

**REQUIEM SET FOR WEDNESDAY**  
A solemn high mass of requiem will be held at St. Anastasia's R. C. Church, Teaneck, Wednesday morning at 8:30 o'clock.

Sheridan was graduated from St. Anastasia's Parochial School and Teaneck High School. Entering service on August 21 last year, he trained with the Army Air Force at Miami Beach and Tyndall Field, Florida; Salt Lake City, Utah; Tucson, Arizona; El Paso, Texas; Denver, Colorado, and Lincoln, Nebraska.

He received his wings at Tyndall Field. He was stationed first in England for 2 weeks then left for Cairo where he remained for another 2 weeks before flying on the Ploesti mission.

Besides his parents, Sheridan is met survived by a sister, Mrs. Albert Mury of Teaneck, the former Miss Doris Sheridan. The Sheridan family formerly lived in Teaneck.

The Mecklenburgs heard from their son about a month ago when he sent home money for War Bonds. They heard from the War Department Saturday he had been killed in action October 1 in Italy. He was with the reconnaissance (Continued on page 2, column 3)
