Preliminary Bout

Teaneck Travels To Lohigh Where Peterson, Gibbons, and Diggelman Score

Teaneck's wrestlers traveled to Haddonfield, Pennsylvania on March 9 to compete in the first annual Interscholastic Wrestling Championship sponsored by Lehigh University.

Teaneck's showing was not so good as they made only 3 points. The winners, Newton, scored 27 points, while Shamokin was second with 25 and Bruckin Poly Prep was third with 19 points.

Gibbons, 125 lbs., was the only Teaneck wrestler to reach the third round. He was defeated by Haddonfield's Newton who went on to take first place.

Hemmer, 105 lbs., Peterson, 125 lbs., Canero, 135 lbs., Hollowell, 155 lbs., and Diggelman, 165 lbs., reached the second round but were eliminated.

The scoring was as follows: 5 points for first place, 3 for second place, and 1 for third place; and an extra point for each fall scored by members of the team. Peterson, Gibbons, and Diggelman each scored the point for Teaneck on falls.
